V. Types of Psalms

H. Messianic psalms.

- <u>Typical Messianic</u>. The subject of the psalm is in some respects a type of Christ (34:20; 69:4,9).
- 2. <u>Typical Prophetic</u>. Language is used which describes the psalmist's present experience but which points beyond his own life and becomes historically true only in Christ (22).
- 3. <u>Indirectly Messianic</u>. At the time of the psalm's composition, it referred to a king or the house of David in general but it awaited final fulfillment in Christ (2; 45; 72).
- 4. <u>Purely Prophetic</u>. Refers solely to Christ without reference to any other son of David (110).
- Enthronement. Anticipates the coming of God and the consummation of His kingdom in the person of Jesus Christ (96-99).
