- Author: Likely David.
- Delitzsch places it after Sennacherib's invasion and destruction and now a crop has been gathered. This does not fit the time of David.
- Barnes and others defend David as the author.

Psalms 65 also speaks of matters particularly close to the heart of David.

- 1. The importance of the house of God. (verse 4; 1 Chronicles 28:1-29:22)
- 2. God's choice of Zion as His dwelling place. (verse 1; 1 Chronicles 21:15-26; 2 Chronicles 3:1)
- 3. The submission of the foreign nations to the God of Israel (verses 2, 5, 8; 1 Samuel 17:45-47).

Psalms 65

Praise And Thanksgiving For God's Abundant Favor To Earth And Man

God's Concern for His people. Verses 1-4

Psalms 65:1, "Praise waiteth for thee, O God, in Zion; and unto thee shall the vow be performed."

- God is not to be worshiped in any way that man pleases.
- Worship was to be offered only to Him, never to anyone or anything else (Deuteronomy 6:13-14; 10:20; Matthew 4:10); and it is to be offered only in the place He has appointed (Deuteronomy 12:5-27), in Zion (between the time of David and the time of Christ, the earthly Mount Zion).
- The reference here is likely to the vows or promises which the people had made in view of the manifest judgments of God and the proofs of His goodness. Psalms 132:13-14; cf. Psalms 22:25; 50:14; 56:12.
 - Those vows they were now ready to carry out in expressions of praise.

God's Concern for His people. Verses 1-4
Psalms 65:2 "O thou that hearest prayer unto the

Psalms 65:2, "O thou that hearest prayer, unto thee shall all flesh come."

- Other gods cannot hear the appeals of their worshipers (cf. 1 Kings 18:29).
- Only the true God has the power to hear prayer and respond to it (cf. 1 Kings 18:37-39).
- NOTE: All flesh shall come to HIM. (Luke 1:28-33; 2:30-32; Colossians 1:6, 23; Revelation 5:9; cf. Galatians 1:6-7)
- No other being can supply man's needs.

God's Concern for His people. Verses 1-4 Psalms 65:3, "Iniquities prevail against me: as for our transgressions, thou wilt forgive them."

- It is God who makes atonement for sin (Psalms 38:4 78:38; 79:9; Deuteronomy. 21:8; 32:43).
 - Man cannot make provisions for his own atonement. cf. Psalms 51:2
