God Commands Repentance

Acts 17:30-31 "All men everywhere ..." Romans 3:23 "for all have sinned ..." **Romans 4:15** "... where there is no law, neither is there transgression."

Therefore, all are under law!

- By John. Matthew 3:2
- By Jesus. Matthew 4:17; Luke 13:3.5
- Great Commission. Luke 24:47
- By Disciples. Mark 6:12
- By Apostles. Acts 2:38; 11:18

REPENTANCE Is Not • Fear Praver Confession "Coming forward" • Being sorry • Doing penance • Simply a reformation • Remorse or regret of life • "If I have ..."

- Being aware of sin

REPENTANCE

- metanoia "a change of mind for the better, heartily to AMEND with abhorrence of one's past sins." (Thayer, 405)
- "This change of mind involves BOTH a turning *from sin and a turning to God."* (W.E. Vine, Volume 3, page 281)
- "John did not call on people to be sorry, but to change their mental attitudes AND CONDUCT." (A.T. Robertson, Word Pictures, Volume 1, page 24)

Examples of Repentance

- Jews on Pentecost, Acts 2:37-38
- Ninevites. Matthew 12:41: cf. Jonah 3:10
- Rebellious son. Matthew 21:28-29
- Prodigal son. Luke 15:11-21

Examples of Repentance

- Thessalonians turned from idols. 1 Thessalonians 1:9
- Ephesians burned their books. Acts 19:19
- Jailor "washed their stripes." Acts 16:33
- Corinthians turned from former practices.
 1 Corinthians 6:9-11

These <u>all</u> brought forth fruit worthy of repentance! cf. Luke 3:8; Acts 26:19-20
