Samaria: Preaching Christ

Acts Chapter 8

Origin of the Samaritans

- Assyrian Captivity. 2 Kings 17
- Jews and Samaritans have no dealings with each other. John 4:9
 - 1. Their religion, though basically Jewish, was mixed with forms of idolatry. 2 Kings 17:32-34,41
 - 2. Though not regarded as totally heathenistic, they were not considered pure by the Jews.
 - 3. The Samaritan's help was refused in the rebuilding of Jerusalem, furthering the embitterment between these two groups. Ezra 4:3-4

Jesus And The Samaritans

- Good Samaritan. Luke 10:30-37; cf. Luke 17:15-16
- Jesus called a Samaritan. John 8:48
- Jesus and the Samaritan woman. John 4

Jesus And The Samaritan Woman John 4

- The woman found Jesus a man of kindness. vs. 16-18
- She learned that Jesus was a breaker of barriers. vs. 7-9
- Jesus introduced the woman to "living water." vs. 10-15
- Jesus knew the hearts of men. vs. 16-19
- Jesus introduced the elements of true worship. vs. 21-24
- The influence of Jesus was felt among the Samaritans. vs. 39-42

Jesus used different teaching techniques

Jesus knew how to handle PREJUDICIAL QUESTIONS. John 4

- 'Jews have no dealings with Samaritans.'' (John 4:9)
- "How is it that thou, being a Jew, askest drink of me, who am a Samaritan woman?" (John 4:9) Jesus did not answer her question.
- "Art thou greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well, and drank thereof himself, and his sons, and his cattle?" (John 4:12)

Effectiveness of Jesus, the Master Teacher

- Jesus created a CRAVING FOR WHAT HE OFFERED. John 4:13-14
- Jesus understood that people have to be TAKEN WHERE THEY ARE and LED TO A HIGHER PLANE. John 4:16-18
- Jesus taught her how to worship. John 4:21-24
- Jesus taught her He was the Messiah. John 4:25-26

Philip And The Samaritans Acts 8 ... Transition

- Beginning .(Acts 2)
- Transition. (Acts 8)
- Philip preached the gospel. vs. 4
- Samaritans were unlikely prospects. John 4:9
- Conflict and triumph.People gave heed. Acts 8:5-6
- Persecution furthers the gospel. Acts 8:1,4

Philip And The Samaritans Acts 8 ... Transition

- Miracles served their purpose in this conversion. vs. 6-12
- Philip and Simon. Acts 8:13
- The power of the gospel. Rom. 1:16; Acts 1:8Broke the power of Simon over the Samaritans.
 - Brought Simon out of sorcery.

What It Means To Preach Christ Acts 8:35

- The Sonship of Jesus. cf. Acts 9:20; Jesus' claims.
- The gospel of Christ. 1 Cor. 1:23 "Christ crucified."(2:2); Cf.1 Cor. 15:1; cf. Mk. 16:15ff
- Concerning the kingdom. Acts 8:5,12; Acts 28:31; Mt. 16:18-19
- The name of Jesus. Phil. 2:9; Col. 3:17; 2 John 9

What It Means To Preach Christ Acts 8

- Baptism. Acts 8:35-36
- Beginning with Scripture. Acts 8:35; Isaiah 53;
 1 Tim. 4:16; Acts 17:2-3
- Beginning where the learner is.

The Answers:

- A. To the jailer, Acts 16:25-31
- B. To audience in Acts 2, vs. 37-38
- C. To Saul of Tarsus, Acts 22:3-10, 16; cf. Acts 9:6

Why Did The Answers Differ? A. <u>The questions were asked by people in different</u> <u>circumstances</u>, Mark 12:34 "not far from the kingdom" Matthew 15:8 "heart is far from me"
