THE TRAGEDY OF BEING LOST

Luke 15

The Tragedy of Carelessness – The Lost Sheep, Vs. 3-7.

- <u>■Thoughtlessness</u>.
 - The figure of the shepherd, sheep and sheepfold found many times in the scriptures. Isa. 53:6ff; Jno. 10:1ff.; Acts 20:28, etc.
 - Heb. 2:1. Cf. Mt. 9: 36, a picture of a multitude that had no real purpose in life.

The Tragedy of Carelessness – The Lost Sheep, Vs. 3-7.

- Absorption in other matters.
 - Many are they who are carelessly absorbed in the treasures and pleasures of this life (cf. Lk. 8:14; 12:16-21; 14:15ff), or the complacency of denominational error (Col 2:8).

The Tragedy of Carelessness – The Lost Sheep, Vs. 3-7.

- Lack of knowledge, spiritual interest and diligence.
 - "Give diligence" 2 Tim. 2:15; Heb. 4:11; 2 Pet. 3:14
 - "Take heed." cf. Amos 4:6ff; 1 Cor. 10:12; Col. 2:8; Heb. 3:12; 2 Pet. 1:19
 - Failure to do this means we are lost. Cf. Hosea 4:6; Isa. 5:6; Acts 17:30.

The Tragedy of Uselessness – The Lost Coin. Vs. 8-10.

- This coin was of no value because it was "out of circulation."
- The useless church member is a lost church member.
 - Many have changed from useful vessels to into useless vessels, from vessels of honor to vessels dishonor (2 Tim. 2:20).
 - Uselessness means: loss of zeal for the Lord, loss of concern for others, and loss of influence, (savor, Mt. 5:13; radiance, Mt. 5:14ff.)
 - The useless member is ... the one who has quit (Lk. 9:62), fallen (Gal. 5:4), does not serve the purpose that God has for him (Mt. 25:24ff).

The Tragedy of Willfulness – The Prodigal Son. Vs. 11-24.

- The Prodigal Son was lost willfully.
 - He willfully asked for his portion of the substance.
 - He willfully went into the far country. With his eyes wide open he went into sin.
 - He willfully wasted his substance with riotous living. He had no one to blame but himself.

The Tragedy of Willfulness – The Prodigal Son. Vs. 11-24.

- The Prodigal Son was lost willfully.
 - Rebellion and defiance of authority. Ex. 32; 2 Sam. 15-18
 - Morally: Ex. 32:7ff
 - Doctrinally: Gen. 3; 1 Tim. 2:14; cf. 2 Pet. 2:1ff
 - Exaltation of my will and a desecration of God's will.
 Rom. 1:18ff; 1 Cor. 1
 - Prejudice. "For this people's heart is waxed gross, And their ears are dull of hearing, And their eyes they have closed" (Mt. 13:15).
 - Greater Damnation. cf. Lk. 12:47, 48; Heb. 10:26ff

The Tragedy of Bitterness – The Elder Brother. Vs. 25-32.

- <u>Self Commendation He had stayed in his</u> father's house.
 - He had served his father. "Lo, these many years do I serve thee."
 - He was never guilty of the immoralities of his brother.

The Tragedy of Bitterness – The Elder Brother. Vs. 25-32.

- Bitterness toward brethren will cause us to be lost in hell as surely as the immoralities of the flesh. They are in the same class. Gal. 5:19ff.
- Love for brethren is abundantly and plainly taught. Jno. 13:34f; 1 Cor. 13; 1 John 2: 9-11, 3:14f., 4:20f.
- The elder brother represents the Pharisees and scribes who stood condemned because they "trusted in themselves that they were righteous; and set all others at nought" (Lk. 18:9).
